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#### Italy, Umbria: New Releases

Here is a batch of wines from Umbria, 92 in total, to get you through the chilly autumn and winter months ahead. Umbria is a land-locked region in central Italy, and although its production veers mostly toward hearty red wines, there are a few crisp and luminous white wines to consider as well.



Downtown Montefalco gears up for a local celebration. This is home to one of Italy's most powerful and structured red wines, Montefalco Sagrantino. Franciscan friars are said to have brought the Sagrantino grape to this area near Assisi to make sacramental wines.



Marco Caprai faces off with his mini me. The Arnaldo Caprai estate makes some of the region's benchmark wines.



French consultant Michel Rolland now works with the team at Arnaldo Caprai. Two of the portfolio standouts are the Montefalco Sagrantino Spinning Beauty and the Montefalco Sagrantino 25 Anni.



This is an Umbrian panorama of Sagrantino vineyards at Arnaldo Caprai.

Umbria takes its local traditions very seriously. The town of Bevagna puts on an annual festival called the Mercato delle Gaite in which professions practiced in the Middle Ages—like ironsmiths, bakers, potters and basket weavers—are reenacted in costume.



The queen of Torgiano is Chiara Lungarotti of the Lungarotti winery. Her family wrote the blueprint for Umbrian wine, and they run one of the most complete and worthwhile wine museums in Italy today.



Lungarotti is the main player in Umbria's Torgiano appellation that focuses on Grechetto (white) and Sangiovese (red) grapes among others. The estate's Torgiano Rosso Riserva Rubesco Vigna Monticchio is a selection of the estate's best Sangiovese.

The beautiful Castello della Sala owned by the Marchesi Antinori group of Florence makes one of Italy's iconic white wines, the Cervaro della Sala (an oak-aged blend of Chardonnay and Grechetto).



Umbria is black truffle territory. This fall dish sees scrambled eggs topped with shaved truffles.

The 2015 Montefalco Rosso is a blend of 70% Sangiovese, 15% Sagrantino and 15% Merlot, all aged in French barrique for 14 months. This is a nicely balanced red with lots of dark fruit layering, succulence and exuberance. That happy richness is very much a part of the vintage personality, and it's nice to see it transmitted to this wine in such a clear and seamless manner. Some 13,000 bottles were made.
